Job Purpose:	<p>This role is focused on leading on one of the priorities of our Global Advocacy Agenda: Improving the accessibility of international climate finance and development funding for local communities across the drylands of Africa, with a strong focus on the Great Green Wall (GGW) Initiative.</p> <p>In partnership with ICRAF-CIFOR and ReSaD (Réseau Sahel Désertification), Tree Aid has built the Mosaic Coalition. This coalition aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Facilitate a more direct disbursement of funding to local civil society and communities in the GGW to restore their environment,• Promote locally led land governance across the GGW. <p>This role will take the lead on coordinating the Mosaic Coalition to raise visibility of its messaging and mission among relevant donors, funders and policy makers, both in country and internationally across the Great Green Wall.</p> <p>The advisor will provide strategic advice to shape the Mosaic coalition strategy & action plan, oversee the development of adequate evidence and lead on its dissemination through engagement in relevant networks and events.</p>
